Local activities/ events

The Maurice Jagger Centre.

The Maurice Jagger is located opposite the bus station, down Winding Road, and has a function room which hosts a variety of activities. They hold a very popular lunch club every Wednesday and Thursday, with the exception of 6 weeks a year- when they give their hard working volunteers a well deserved break. The cost of the 3 course lunch is £5.00 and consists of soup, a main course desert and tea/coffee. You do have to book, as it is not a walk in service, and they can be contacted on 01422 364691. They do also offer a transport service but this does have a small cost and also needs to be booked in advance.

The Old Courthouse

In the old Courthouse at Blackwall, just a short walk from Waterhouse Homes, there are a number of businesses including a coffee shop called Rhythm and Brews.

Calderdale Music is holding a 'Music at The Magistrates Court' event on Tuesday 12th September 2023:

- 6:00-6:30pm: Live music at Rhythm and Brews café, song lyrics and sheet music will be provided if you want to play or sing along or just come and listen with a brew!
- 6:30pm-6:50pm: Guided tour of the building (not usually open to the public).
- 6:50pm-7:10pm: Singing workshops in Courtroom One with Cube Choir (you are welcome to listen if you don't want to take part).

The café, Rhythm and Brews, is open to the public and their opening hours are Tuesday 4.30pm-7.00pm, Wednesday 11.00am-7.00pm, Thursday 11.00am-3.00pm, Friday 11.00am-2.00pm and Saturday 9.15am-1.00pm.

The AccessBus

AccessBus is a dial-a-ride service providing door to door local transport, seven days a week between 9am and 5pm.

The driver assists passengers from door to door, including boarding and alighting. The buses are fully accessible, fitted with seatbelts and the most up to date wheelchair restraints.

Travel is restricted to local journey and most are for shopping purposes such as to the local supermarket. They do provide a limited number of journeys for social purposes such as local community centres, places of worship and visits to family and friends.

It is unlikely that AccessBus will be able to cater for day and time-specific requests and to make best use of vehicles they serve certain areas on set days, allocating places to customers to travel on the day when the bus is in their area.

Anyone of any age can register for AccessBus. To register you can call them on 0113 3481903, Monday to Friday between 7.30am and 4.00pm. You can also print an application online on the WyMetro website (or ask Cath to print this for you).

Once you are registered you receive a welcome letter with a reference number and details of how to book the service. They take reservation bookings a maximum of 6 days and a minimum of two days in advance of travel.

People with ENCTS permits, such as Senior, Disabled or Blind persons pass travel FREE.

For other adults there is a flat fare of £3.00 each way.
